STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and forty-
four of the Revised Statutes, relating to State Pen-
sions.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section two of chapter one hundred and forty-four
2 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by
3 striking out the words "from wounds or injury
4 sustained in the service while in the line of duty,"
5 so that said section as amended shall read as fol-
6 lows:

'SECT. 2. The widow during her widowhood,
8 orphan children under twelve years of age, orphan
9 minor children over twelve years of age, who are

10 partially or totally disabled by accident or chronic
11 sickness, or the dependent parent or sister of any
12 soldier or seaman deceased, are entitled to the same
13 pension as is provided in the preceding section, and
14 under similar conditions, *provided*, that no more
15 than eight dollars a month shall be paid one family.]
