# STATE OF MAINE.

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT relating to the use of Railroad Passenger Stations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever any railroad passenger 2 station shall be erected or maintained in any city 3 or town in this State, any railroad corporation 4 having or using a track or passenger station within 5 such city or town shall have the right to run its 6 passenger trains to and from such station over any 7 railroad track or tracks leading thereto as herein 8 provided, and to use the same for the purpose of 9 delivering and receiving through passengers, under 10 such reasonable terms and regulations and over

11 such tracks as may be agreed upon by the owner 12 of such station, the railroad whose tracks are used 13 in running to and from the same, and the railroad 14 corporation so desiring its use for said purpose, 15 and in case of disagreement, upon petition, notice 16 and hearing thereon, the railroad commissioners 17 shall fix and determine such terms, tracks and reg-18 ulations. No corporation which shall deny in any 19 proceedings the authority of the railroad commis-20 sioners to proceed and make the determination as 21 herein provided, or which shall refuse to abide by 22 their decision rendered therein, shall avail itself of 23 the provisions of this act.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
