IN^CTHE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND BIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT amendatory of and additional to chapter twenty-six of the Revised Statutes, relating to Fire Escapes in and upon certain buildings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section thirty of chapter twenty-six of
2 the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by insert3 ing after the word "date," in the fifth line thereof,
4 the words 'and a reasonable compensation for such
5 inspection and certificate shall be paid by the city
6 or town in which any such building is located,' so
7 that said section as amended shall read as follows:
'SECT. 30. Whenever the municipal officers or
9 engineers, upon inspection, find that proper safe-

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10 guards and precautions for escape in case of fire, 11 or of alarm, have been provided, they shall give to 12 the occupant of such building a certificate, under 13 their hands, of such fact, which shall be valid for 14 one year only from its date; and a reasonable com-15 pensation for such inspection shall be paid by the 16 city or town in which any such building is located, 17 by an order drawn upon its treasurer. Such offi-18 cers shall return to the clerk's office of their town, 19 monthly, a list of such certificates by them issued, 20 which the clerk shall record in a suitable book.'

SECT. 2. Section thirty-one of chapter twenty-2 six of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by 3 striking out, in the first and second lines, the 4 words "shall pay to such officer two dollars there-5 for, and," so that said section as amended shall 6 read as follows:

'SECT. 31. Every person receiving such certifi-8 cate shall keep such certificate posted in such 9 building. Such annual certificate, so posted, is 10 prima facie evidence of the inspection of such 11 building, and of the presence of such suitable safe-12 guards and precautions. Every occupant of such 13 building who neglects or refuses to procure such 14 certificate, or to post the same as aforesaid, forfeits 15 ten dollars for every week that he so neglects and 16 refuses.'
