STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section twelve of chapter fortysix of the Revised Statutes relating to the Transfer of Certificates of Stock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section twelve of chapter forty-six of the Revised 2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the 3 word "but" in the third line of said section and in-4 serting in said line after the word "delivery" the 5 following: 'and no attachment of such stock as 6 the property of the vender, made after such sale, 7 assignment, or transfer, shall defeat the title or 8 affect the rights of the vendee if the record here-9 inafter prescribed is made within ten days after

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10 such delivery; but after the expiration of said 11 time,' so that said section shall read as follows:

'When the capital of a corporation is divided into 13 shares, and certificates thereof are issued, they may 14 be transferred by indorsement and delivery, and 15 no attachment of such stock, as the property of 16 the vender, made after such sale, assignment, or 17 transfer, shall defeat the title or affect the rights 18 of the vendee if the record hereinafter prescribed 19 is made within ten days after such delivery; but 20 after the expiration of said time, such transfer is 21 not valid, except between the parties thereto, until 22 the same is so entered on the books of the corpora-23 tion as to exhibit the names and residences of the par-24 ties, the number of the shares, and the date of their 25 transfer. Certificates of shares shall be issued to 26 those entitled to them by transfer or otherwise, 27 signed by the president and attested by the cashier, 28 clerk, or treasurer. Neither shall sign blanks and 29 leave them for use by the other, nor sign them 30 without knowledge of the apparent title of the 31 person to whom they are issued. In case of the 32 absence or disability of either of said officers, the 33 signature of a majority of the directors in his stead 34 is sufficient.'
