STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine Insane Hospital.

Resolved, That the trustees of the Maine Insane

- 2 Hospital are hereby authorized and instructed to
- 3 take in charge the erection and construction of
- 4 additions to the so-called new chapel, according to
- 5 plans now in the hands of said trustees, for the
- 6 purposes of enlarging the chapel, bakery, store-
- 7 room and kitchen, and for increased accommoda-
- 8 tions for attendants, also for enlarging and repair-
- 9 ing the laundry.

The amount to be expended for these purposes

- 11 shall not exceed twenty-one thousand dollars
- 12 (\$21,000).

The said trustees are also authorized and directed 14 to erect at some place on the hospital premises a 15 building suitable for the accommodation of about 16 one hundred patients according to plans now in 17 the hands of said trustees.

The cost of said building shall not exceed twenty-19 five thousand dollars (\$25,000).

The sum of forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) 21 is hereby appropriated for the purposes above 22 named, of which twenty-five thousand dollars 23 (\$25,000) shall be payable during the year one 24 thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and 25 twenty-one thousand dollars (\$21,000) during the 26 year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight; 27 and it is hereby provided that the trustees may 28 draw from the accrued funds and current income 29 of the hospital during the years above named such 30 sums as may be necessary to furnish such build-31 ings; but not more than eighty-five per cent of 32 such funds or income shall be used in any one 33 year.
