### STATE OF MAINE.

### RESOLVE in favor of Isaac D. Fuller of Buckfield.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury

- 2 of the State to Isaac D. Fuller of Buckfield the
- 3 sum of twelve dollars per month as a military pen-
- 4 sion, during the pleasure of the Legislature, com-
- 5 mencing January one, eighteen hundred and
- 6 eighty-seven, the above pension being in lieu of
- 7 all State aid.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Isaac D. Fuller was a member of Co. A., 30th Maine Reg't Inft., and served with the regiment until its final muster out. Was afterwards pensioned by the U. S. at the rate of \$4.00 per month on account of heart disease. He is a member of Fessenden Post G. A R., located at Buckfield.

The celebration at Buckfield 4th of July last was under the auspices of Fessenden Post, and Mr. Fuller was detailed by the Post to fire the national salute, and in so doing was injured by a premature discharge in the following manner, viz: One arm blown off above the elbow and the other between the wrist joint and the elbow, and was otherwise severely injured.

Mr. Fuller is possessed of no real or personal estate except a small amount of household furniture, and the various G. A. R. posts in the State have thus far voluntarily contributed to his support.

His family consists of a wife and four children, the youngest child being ten years of age. He is now receiving State aid at the rate of \$8.00 per month.
