STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section six of chapter twenty of
the Revised Statutes, in relation to Ferries.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

That section six of chapter twenty of the Revised
2 Statutes be and hereby is amended so as to read as
3 follows:

“Any person who makes it a business of keeping
5 a ferry contrary to the provisions of sections one
6 and two, or without such authority transports any
7 passengers or property across any river in this
8 State within two miles of a licensed or established
9 ferry or toll bridge, or furnishes a boat or other

10 craft for that purpose, shall forfeit four dollars for
11 each day such boat is run, or for each time of
12 transportation, except for his own personal use or
13 necessity, whether he receives any compensation
14 for such transportation or not, to be recovered by
15 complaint or indictment, and is also liable to the
16 party injured and keeping the ferry or toll bridge
17 as aforesaid, in damages sustained by them to be
18 recovered in an action on the case.”
