STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled, "An Act to establish a State Board of Health," approved February 27th, A. D. 1885.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section six of chapter two hundred 2 and eighty-six, of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, is hereby amended, by striking 3 out the word "three" in the first line thereof, and 4 inserting in its place the word 'five,' so that said 5 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'SECT. 6. The sum of five thousand dollars, per 8 annum, or as much thereof as may be deemed 9 necessary by the State Board of Health, is hereby

10 appropriated to pay the salary of the Secretary,
11 meet the contingent expenses of the office of the
12 Secretary, and the expenses of the Board, which
13 shall not exceed the sum hereby appropriated. Said
14 expenses shall be certified, and paid in the same
15 manner as the salary of the Secretary.'

SECT. 2. Section two, of said chapter, is hereby
2 amended in the last clause thereof, by striking out
3 the word "legislature," in the second line of said
4 clause, and inserting in place thereof the words
5 'governor and council;' and adding the following
6 words to the end of said clause: 'Three thousand
7 copies of said report shall be printed,' so that said
8 clause, as amended, shall read as follows:

'And they shall, in the month of January, make
10 a report to the Governor and Council of their do-
11 ings, investigations and discoveries, during the year
12 ending on the thirty-first day of December, with
13 such suggestions as to legislative action as they
14 may deem necessary. Three thousand copies of
15 said report shall be printed.'
