STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the Employment of the Con-
victs at the Maine State Prison.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No more than one-tenth of all the
2 male convicts in the Maine State Prison, shall be
3 employed, at any time, in any one industry, or in
4 the manufacture of any one kind of goods.

SECT. 2. The manufacture and repair of all kinds
2 of wagons, carriages and sleighs, except the manu-
3 facture of infant carriages, shall be considered one
4 industry within the meaning of this act.

SECT. 3. So far as practicable, the industries
2 upon which said convicts shall be employed, shall

3 be the manufacture of articles not elsewhere man-
4 ufactured in this State.

SECT. 4. All articles and goods manufactured at
2 the prison for sale, shall be distinctly labeled or
3 branded with these words, "manufactured at the
4 Maine State Prison."

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect September
2 1st, A. D. 1887.
