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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

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AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and sixty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-five.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section one of chapter two hundred sixty-two of  
2 the Public Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-five  
3 is hereby amended by striking out all before the  
4 word "as" in the fifth line and inserting in lieu  
5 thereof the following words: 'It shall be the duty  
6 of all persons who are now, or may hereafter derive  
7 special benefits from legislation for the protection  
8 of fish, in any of the waters of this State, in excess  
9 of what is, or may be derived by others to publish  
10 such protection by posting and maintaining notices

11 substantially, so that said section as amended shall  
12 read as follows:

‘SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of all persons  
14 who are now, or may hereafter derive special ben-  
15 efits from legislation for the protection of fish in  
16 any waters of this State, in excess of what is de-  
17 rived by others, to publish such protection by post-  
18 ing and maintaining notice substantially as herein-  
19 after provided. Said notices shall be placed on the  
20 banks or shores of such protected waters, not more  
21 than ten feet, nor less than six feet above the  
22 ground, in a conspicuous position; and if on run-  
23 ning water such notices shall be not more than one-  
24 half mile apart on the banks of such waters; and  
25 if on a pond or lake, not more than one mile apart  
26 on the shores of such pond or lake.’
