STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND BIGHT HUNDRED AND BIGHTY-SEVEN.

An Act to amend section thirty-one of chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes, relating to Free High Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirty-one of chapter eleven

- 2 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by strik-
- 3 ing out the word "wholly," in the fourth line, all of
- 4 the fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth and ninth lines. and
- 5 the words "prescribed courses of study," in the tenth
- 6 line, and by inserting in place thereof the words 'by
- 7 direction of the superintending school committee,'
- 8 so that said section as amended shall read:

'Section 31. The course of study in the free 10 high schools shall embrace the ordinary English 11 academic studies, especially the natural sciences in 12 their application to mechanics, manufactures and 13 agriculture; but the ancient or modern languages 14 shall not be taught therein, except by direction of 15 the superintending school committees having 16 supervision thereof. Such schools, when estab-17 lished by any town or union of towns, shall be 18 free to all the youth in such town or towns, on 19 such attainments of scholarship as shall be fixed 20 by the committees having supervision thereof. 21 When such school is established by any district or 22 union of districts, it shall be free in the same man-23 ner to the scholars within such districts, and open 24 also to scholars passing the required examination 25 from without such districts, but within the towns 26 in which said districts are situated, on payment to 27 the agent of the district in which such school is 28 located, of such tuition, to be fixed by the super-29 intending school committee or committees having 30 supervision of the same, as is equivalent to the 31 cost a scholar of maintaining such school, after 32 deducting the aid extended by the State. When-33 ever, in the judgment of the superintending 34 school committees having the supervision of any

35 free high school or schools, the number of pupils 36 in the same may be increased without detriment, 37 scholars from without the towns, directly interested 38 in such school or schools, may be admitted to the 39 same on passing the required examination and 40 paying such tuition as may be fixed by such com-41 mittee, to the treasurer of the town in which the 42 school is kept, when the school is maintained by a 43 town or union of towns, or to the agent of the 44 district in which the school is kept, when such 45 school is maintained by a district or union of 46 districts.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
