STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

AN ACT to incorporate the Commercial Union Telegraph Company of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. H. S. Osgood, S. R. Small, W. T.

- 6 K. O'Brion, their associates, successors and assigns,
- 7 are hereby created a body corporate, by the name
- 8 of the "Commercial Union Telegraph Company of
- 9 Maine," with all the rights and privileges, and sub-
- 10 ject to all the duties provided by the general laws

11 of this State, relating to corporations, with power 12 by that name, to sue and be sued, to have and use 13 a common seal, and the same to be changed at 14 pleasure; to establish any and all by-laws and reg-15 ulations for the management of their affairs not 16 repugnant to the laws of this State, and to do and 17 perform any and all other legal, and lawful acts 18 incident to similar corporations; and said company 19 shall have the right to locate and construct its 20 lines of telegraph upon and along any public high-21 way or bridge or along or upon the line of any 22 railroad, and subject to existing provisions of law 23 but in such manner as not to incommode or en-24 danger the customary public use thereof; and the 25 company may cut down any trees standing within 26 the limits of any highway, except fruit, ornamental 27 or shade trees, when necessary for the erection, use 28 or safety of its lines.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized 2 and empowered to construct, maintain and operate 3 lines of telegraph between the eastern and western 4 boundaries of this State, with as many wires and 5 branches as they may deem necessary in carrying 6 out the purposes of their charter, commencing and 7 terminating at such point or points as they may 8 select hereafter within the limits of the State.

Sect. 3. The capital stock of said company is 2 hereby established at one hundred thousand dollars, 3 and said corporation is authorized to issue the 4 bonds of the corporation to an amount not exceed-5 ing fifty thousand dollars, and secure the same on 6 the franchises and property of the corporation, the 7 same to be used for the exclusive purpose of con-8 structing, maintaining and operating the lines of 9 telegraph hereby authorized, and said corporation 10 may purchase, hold and dispose of such real and 11 personal estate as may be necessary for the pur-12 poses aforesaid; the stock of said corporation may 13 from time to time be increased to a sum not exceed-14 ing in all two hundred thousand dollars.

SECT. 4. This company shall have power, by 2 agreement with any other persons or bodies corposite to connect their lines with other lines of tele-4 graph within and without the State, but no 5 discrimination against any newspaper published in 6 the State of Maine shall be made as to the rates 7 established for doing business, and no sale or transfer of this charter shall be made to any other 9 company without authority from the legislature of 10 this State.

SECT. 5. Any two of the persons named in this 2 act of incorporation may call the first meeting of

- 4 each of his associates.

Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
