STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Hamlin Plantation.

Resolved, That one hundred dollars be and hereby
2 is appropriated to aid Hamlin Plantation in re-
3 building a bridge across Hammond brook in said
4 plantation, the same to be expended under the
5 direction of the county commissioners of Aroos-
6 took county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The bridge referred to in the resolve was built in the summer of 1887 at a cost of \$430, \$200 of which was granted by the State in 1887 and \$230 raised by Hamlin Plantation. In September, 1888, during a heavy freshet thirty-five feet of the embankment at east end of bridge was washed away, carrying away about five-eighths of the bridge and damaging the remainder. Last fall the bridge was partially repaired at an expense of \$190, and the completion of the work in the spring will cost at least \$100 more. Damage sustained at this bridge and others makes the expense to the plantation a heavy burden.
