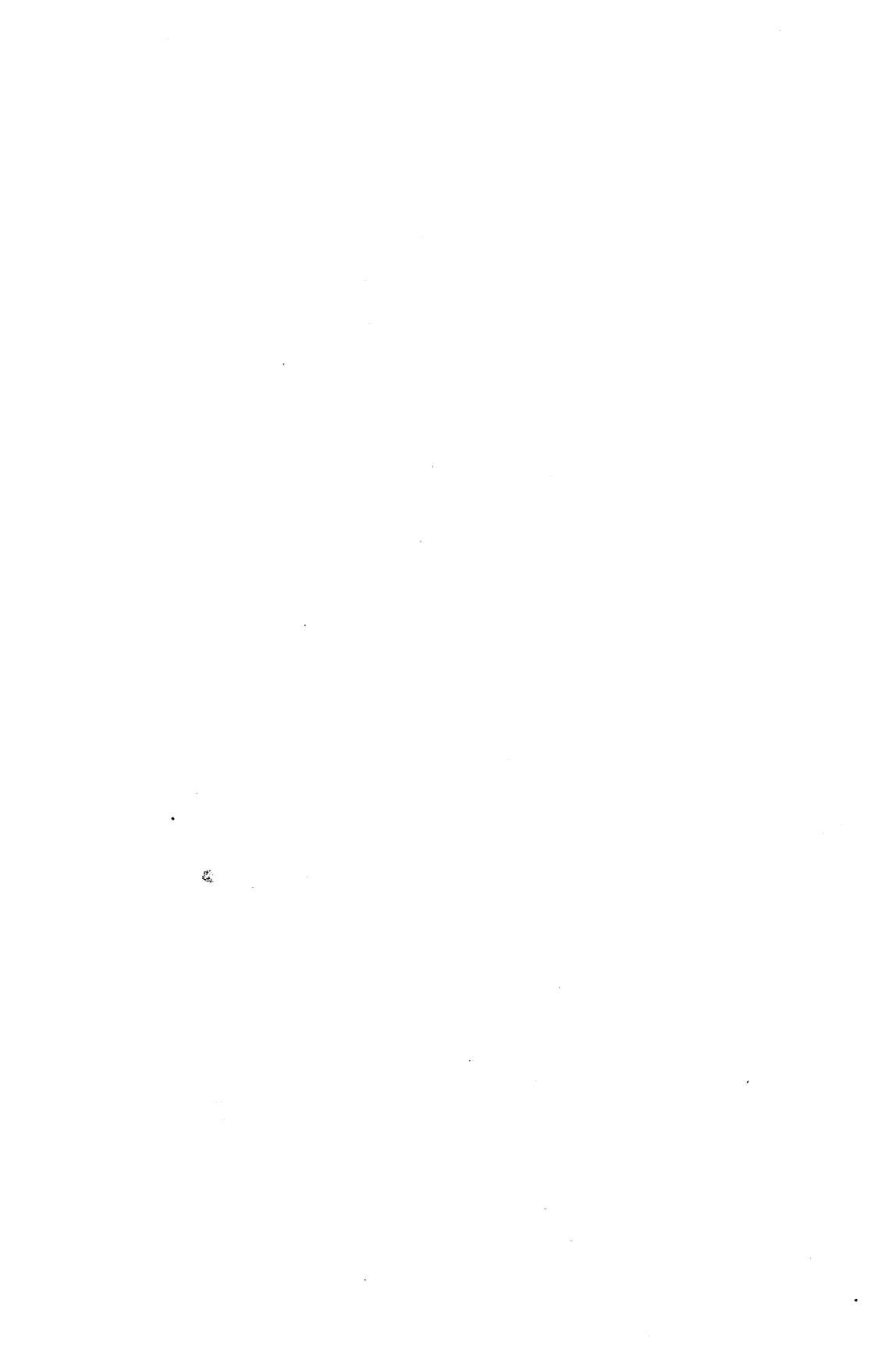
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to make the first Monday in September of each
year a Labor Holiday.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The first Monday of September in each
2 year, being the day celebrated and known as Labor's Holi-
3 day, is hereby made a legal public holiday, to all intents
4 and purposes, in the same manner as Thanksgiving, Fast,
5 and Christmas days, the twenty-second of February, the
6 thirtieth day of May, the fourth day of July, are now by
7 law made public holidays.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
