STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND BIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT concerning Innholders, Boarding-House Keepers and their Guests.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Whoever puts up at an inn, and 2 without having an express agreement for credit, 3 procures food, entertainment or accommodation 4 without paying therefor, and with intent to defraud 5 the owner or keeper of the inn out of the pay for 6 the same; or, with intent to cheat or defraud such 7 owner or keeper out of the pay therefor, obtains 8 credit at an inn for such food, entertainment or 9 accommodation by means of any false show of 10 baggage or effects brought thereto; or with such

11 intent, removes or causes to be removed any bag12 gage or effects from an inn or boarding house,
13 while there is a lien existing thereon for the proper
14 charges due from him for fare and board furnished
15 therein, shall be punished by imprisonment not
16 exceeding three months, or by fine not exceeding
17 fifty dollars.

SECT. 2. Innholders shall post up a printed copy 2 of sections one and two of this act in a conspicu-3 ous place in each room of their inns.
