IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 55 of chapter 38, Revised
Statutes, relating to Pressed Hay.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 55 of chapter 38 of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting
3 in the first and sixth lines the following words,
4 'except hay pressed by farmers, and retailed from
5 their own barns,' so that said section as amended
6 shall read as follows:

'SECT. 55. All hay pressed and put up in bundles,
8 except hay pressed by farmers, and retailed from
9 their own barns shall have the first letter of their
10 Christian and the whole of the surname of the

11 person putting up the same, written, printed or
12 stamped on bands or boards made fast thereto,
13 with the name of the State and the place where
14 such person lives. Whoever offers for sale or
15 shipment any pressed hay not marked as aforesaid,
16 except hay pressed by farmers, and retailed from
17 their own barn, forfeits one dollar for each bale so
18 offered, to be recovered by complaint.'
