STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making an appropriation for aid in building a county road through St. Francis Plantation, up the right basin of the St. John river, up to Allagash.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars
2 be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of
3 aiding in the construction of a road through St.
4 Francis Plantation, up the right basin of the St.
5 John river, up to Allagash, and that said appro-
6 priation shall be laid out under the direction of the
7 county commissioners of Aroostook county.



STATEMENT.

This extension of county road through St. Francis Plantation is deemed almost indispensable, as some settlers have lived in that section for fifty years, with no other means of communication with the outside world than the river, and to the end that they should have their mails, and better school advantages, and better advantages generally, it seems necessary this road should be built.

The people of St. Francis Plantation are poor, valuation in 1880 being only \$20,000, and without aid in constructing said road it would be very burdensome indeed for them to construct it.
