## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend Sections 2 and 4 of Chapter 138 of the Public Laws of 1887, entitled "An Act to extirpate Contagious Diseases among Cattle."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECT. 1. Section 2 of chapter 138 of the Public Laws
- 2 of 1887 is hereby amended by inserting in the fifth line
- 3 after the word "Commissioners," the words: 'their duly
- 4 constituted agent'; also by striking out in the twenty-
- 5 first and twenty-second lines of said section, after the
- 6 words "animals affected with," the words "or that have
- 7 been exposed to." Also by striking out in the twenty-
- 8 fourth and twenty-fifth lines, after the word "destroyed,"
- 9 the words "except as hereinafter provided." Also by
- 10 striking out in the twenty-fifth line, after the word "pay,"
- 11 the words "in case of diseased animals." Also by
- 12 striking out in the twenty-sixth line, after the word

13 "thereof," the words "three-fourths," and inserting 14 instead the words 'one-half.' Also by striking out in the 15 twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth lines, 16 after the word "infection," the words "and the full 17 appraised value in case of animals exposed to either of 18 such diseases, but not themselves actually diseased." 19 Also by inserting in the thirty-fifth line, before the word 20 "pedigree," the word 'recordable.' Also by inserting 21 in the thirty-ninth line, after the word "high seas," the 22 words or that may have been brought into this State 23 within one year previous to such animal's showing 24 evidence of such disease.' Also strike out the words in 25 the thirty-first line of said section 2 of said chapter, 26 "they shall not pay," and insert in their place, 'no 27 appraised value shall be,' so that section amended shall 28 read as follows, viz:

SECT. 2. That it shall be the duties of the said 2 commissioners to cause investigation to be made as to the 3 existence of tuberculosis, pleuro-pneumonia, foot and 4 mouth disease, and any other infectious or contagious dis-5 eases. And such commissioners, or their duly consti-6 tuted agent, are hereby authorized to enter any premises 7 or places, including stock yards, cars and vessels, within 8 any county, or part of the State, in or at which they have 9 reason to believe there exists any such diseases, and to 10 make search, investigation and inquiry in regard to the 11 existence thereof. Upon the discovery of the existence 12 of any of the said diseases, the said commissioners are 13 hereby authozized to give notice, by publication, of the 14 existence of such disease, and the locality thereof, in such 15 newspapers as they may select, and notify, in writing,

16 the officials or agents of any railroad, steamboat, or other 17 transportation company doing business in or through such 18 infected locality, of the existence of such disease; and are 19 hereby authorized and required to establish and maintain 20 such quarantine of animals, places, premises, or localities 21 as they may deem necessary to prevent the spread of any 22 such disease, and also to cause the appraisal of the ani-23 mal or animals affected with the said diseases, in accord-24 ance with such rules and regulations by them, as herein-25 after authorized and provided, and also to cause the same 26 to be destroyed, and to pay the owner or owners thereof 27 one-half of their appraised value, as determined upon the 8 basis of health before infection, out of any moneys appro-29 priated by the legislature for that purpose; provided, 30 however, that no appraised value shall be more than two 31 hundred dollars for an animal with pedigree recorded or 32 recordable in the recognized herd-books of the breed in 33 which the animal destroyed may belong, nor more than 34 one hundred dollars for an animal that has no recordable 35 pedigree; provided, further, that in no case shall com-36 pensation be allowed for an animal destroyed under the 37 provisions of this act, which may have contracted or been 38 exposed to such disease in a foreign country, or on the 39 high seas, or that may have been brought into this State 40 within one year previous to such animal's showing evi-41 dence of such disease; nor shall compensation be allowed 42 any owner who, in person, or by agent, knowingly and 43 wilfully conceals the existence of such disease, or the 44 fact of exposure thereto in animals of which the person 45 making such concealment, by himself or agent, is in 46 whole or part owner.'

- SECT. 2. Sect. 7 of said act is hereby amended by 2 striking out "cattle" wherever it appears in said section, 3 and inserting in its place the word 'animals.'
- SECT. 3. Section 4 of chapter 138 of the Public Laws 2 of 1887 is hereby amended by inserting in the third, fourth 3 and eight lines, after the word "them" the words; 'their 4 duly constituted agent' so that said section as amended 5 shall read as follows:
- 'Sect. 4. That any person or persons, who shall know-2 ingly and wilfully refuse permission to said commissioners 3 or either of them, or their duly constituted agent to 4 make, or who knowingly and wilfully obstruct said com-5 missioners or either of them or their duly constituted 6 agents in making all necessary examinations of and as to 7 animals supposed by said commissioners to be diseased as 8 aforesaid or in destroying the same or who knowingly 9 attempt to prevent said commissioners, or either of them 10 or their duly constituted agent from entering upon the 11 promises and other places hereinbefore specified where 12 any of said diseases are by said commissioners supposed 13 to exist, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and 14 upon conviction thereof or of either of the Acts in this sec-15 tion prohibited shall be punished by fine not exceeding one 16 hundred dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding ninety 17 days or by both fine and imprisonment at the discretion 18 of the court.'
