## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section thirty-one of chapter one hundred of the Public Laws of 1887, relating to the teaching of Music in Free High Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section thirty-one of chapter one
- 2 hundred of the Public Laws of 1887 is hereby
- 3 amended by inserting after "languages" in the
- 4 fifth line the words 'and music,' so that said sec-
- 5 tion as amended shall read:
  - 'Sect. 31. The course of study in the free high
- 7 schools shall embrace the ordinary English aca-
- 8 demic studies, especially the natural sciences in
- 9 their application to mechanics, manufactures and

10 agriculture: but the ancient or modern languages 11 and music shall not be taught therein except by 12 direction of the superintending school committees, 13 having supervision thereof. Such schools, when 14 established by any town or union of towns, shall 15 be free to all the youth in such town or towns, on 16 such attainments of scholarship as shall be fixed 17 by the committee having supervision thereof. 18 When such school is established by any district or 19 union of districts, it shall be free in the same man-20 ner to the scholars within such districts, and open 21 also to scholars passing the required examination 22 from without such districts, but within the towns 23 in which such districts are situated, in payment to 24 the agent of the district in which such school is 25 located, of such tuition, to be fixed by the super-26 intending school committee or committees having 27 supervision of the same, as is equivalent to the cost 28 a scholar of maintaining such school, after deduct-29 ing the aid extended by the State. Whenever in 30 the judgment of the superintending school com-31 mittee having the supervision of any free high 32 school or schools, the number of pupils in the same 33 may be increased without detriment, scholars from 34 without the towns, directly interested in such school 35 or schools, may be admitted to the same on passing 36 the required examination and paying such tuition 37 as may be fixed by such committee, to the treas-38 urer of the town in which the school is kept, when 39 the school is maintained by a town or union of 40 towns, or to the agent of the district in which the 41 school is kept, where such school is maintained by 42 a district or union of districts.
