STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Elmira H. Sanders of Bath.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury
2 of the State, to Elmira H. Sanders of Bath, the
3 sum of eight dollars per month, as a military pen-
4 sion, during the pleasure of the legislature, com-
5 mencing January 1st, 1889.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

John Sanders, husband of Elmira H., enlisted in the army of the United States in the year 1858, served for five years and was honorably discharged. Said John Sanders died in February, 1888, and left said Elmira H. with five children, four of whom are dependent upon her for support. She is without property or means of support, is in very poor health and unable to earn sufficient for the maintenance of herself and children. Her husband's service during the late civil war being in the regular army, he was not credited upon the quota of Maine, therefore she does not become a beneficiary under the State Pension Aid Appropriation. She has applied for a pension from the general government, but the same has not been allowed.
