STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Inhabitants of New Sweden.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he hereby 2 is directed to convey by a proper deed of convey-3 ance Lot No. one hundred and seventeen and one-4 half in New Sweden Plantation, to the inhabitants 5 of said New Sweden Plantation to be held by said 6 inhabitants for the use of said inhabitants for public 7 purposes till said Plantation shall become a town, 8 and after said Plantation shall have been incorpor-9 ated asia town, to be held by its inhabitants forever 10 to their use for public purposes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The lot mentioned in the foregoing resolve has upon it a building known popularly as the Capitol built by the State for the use of the people of the colony. It contains a hall which has been used for plantation purposes and religious service. It was originally poorly constructed and is greatly in need of repair. Hitherto the State has expended more or less upon it. The Swedish colony is anxious that it shall be put in repair. They are anxious also to have a conveyance of the lot, that a portion of it may be used for a cemetery and a church may be built upon another. The is no timber on the lot and it is not valuable for farming purposes.
