STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to protect employes at frogs and guard-
rails.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Every railroad corporation operating
2 a railroad or part of a railroad in this State shall
3 before the first day of January in the year 1890,
4 adjust, fill or block the frogs and guard-rails on its
5 track, with the exception of guard-rails on bridges,
6 so as to prevent the feet of the employes from
7 being caught therein. This work shall be done to
8 the satisfaction of the railroad commissioners.

SECT. 2. Any railroad corporation failing to
2 comply with the provisions of this act shall be

3 punished by a fine of not less than one hundred
4 dollars nor more than five hundred dollars.
