STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend Sect. 98 of Chap. 11 of the Revised Statutes, relating to forfeitures for teaching without a certificate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 98 of chap. 11 of the Revised Statutes, is hereby

- 2 amended by inserting after the word "district" in the first
- 3 line, the words "or town," and by adding to said section
- 4 the following words, "provided, that any town may, by
- 5 vote, on an article in the warrant calling any legal meet-
- 6 ing, employ its supervisor to instruct any of its schools
- 7 and fix his compensation therefor; in such case the cer-
- 8 tificate hereinbefore mentioned shall not be required," so
- 9 that said section as amended shall read as follows:-

SECT. 98. Whoever teaches a district or town school

- 11 without first obtaining a certificate from the school com-
- 12 mittee of the town, forfeits not exceeding the sum con-

- 13 tracted for his daily wages, for each day he so teaches,
- 14 and is barred from receiving pay therefor; and no cer-
- 15 tificate shall be valid for more than one year without the
- 16 approval of the superintending school committee annually
- 17 indorsed thereon; provided, that any town may, by vote,
- 18 on an article in the warrant calling any legal meeting,
- 19 employ its supervisor to instruct any of its schools and
- 20 fix his compensation therefor; in such case the certificate
- 21 hereinbefore mentioned shall not be required.'
