STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of York.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of
2 State out of the school funds of the current year,
3 to the town of York, four hundred and twenty-
4 eight dollars and forty cents (\$428.40), it being a
5 balance equitably due said town as its proportion
6 of the school funds for the year eighteen hundred
7 and eighty-seven.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

A sworn statement made by the Selectmen of the town of York, the town's books, and the returns of the agents of the different districts, show that there were 764 legal scholars in the town in 1887. The returns made to the superintendent of schools show that 512 was the number that drew school money. The error was probably made in adding. The difference 252 at \$1.70 (the proportionate amount for each scholar for that year) amounts to \$428.40.
