STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter two hundred and twenty-five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty, relating to the Militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter two hundred
2 and twenty-five of the Public Laws of eighteen
3 hundred and eighty is hereby amended by striking
4 out all of said section after the word "biennially"
5 in the eighteenth line, and inserting instead the
6 words 'a certified report of the total number en-
7 rolled upon their lists, the number marked exempt
8 by reason of disability, the number exempt by rea-
9 son of other causes, the number of minors and the

10 number of volunteer militia,' so that said section
11 as amended shall read as follows:

'SECT. 1. The names of all male citizens of this
13 State, between the ages of eighteen and forty-five,
14 shall, biennially, in April, be enrolled alphabeti-
15 cally by the assessors of the several cities, towns
16 and plantations in which they respectfully reside.
17 On such enrollments, and opposite the name of
18 every person exempt from military duty, or a minor,
19 or in the volunteer militia, the assessors shall write
20 'exempt,' and the reason of such exemption or
21 'minor' or 'volunteer militia,' as the case may be.
22 Said lists shall contain the whole number enrolled
23 in their respective cities, towns and plantations,
24 and the number exempt on said rolls. They shall
25 subscribe and make oath to said lists, that, in their
26 opinion, and to the best of their knowledge and
27 belief, they are true. They shall file said lists in
28 the offices of the respective city, town or plantation
29 clerks on or before the first day of May, biennially.
30 The city, town or plantation clerks shall forward to
31 the adjutant general, on or before the tenth day of
32 May, biennially, a certified report of the total
33 number enrolled upon their lists, the number
34 marked exempt by reason of disability, the number

35 exempt by reason of other causes, the number of
36 minors and the number of volunteer militia.'
