STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT restraining the sale of tobacco and use of
same by minors under sixteen years of age.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person shall sell any cigarette,
2 snuff or tobacco in any form to any person under
3 the age of sixteen years.

SECT. 2. No person, other than the minor's
2 parent or guardian shall give to any person under
3 the age of sixteen years any cigarette, snuff or
4 tobacco in any form for such minor's personal use.

SECT. 3. Any person violating any of the fore-
2 going provisions shall be punished by a fine not
3 exceeding fifty dollars.

SECT. 4. Any minor under the age of sixteen
2 years who shall smoke any cigarette or tobacco in
3 any form in any street, alley, way, park, school yard,
4 public conveyance, place of amusement or other
5 place of resort, shall be punished for the first offence
6 by a fine not exceeding five dollars, and for the
7 second or subsequent offence by a fine not exceed-
8 ing ten dollars.

Senate Amendments.

February 8, 1889.

“A.” SECTION. 1. No person shall sell any cigarette to any person under the age of sixteen years.

SECT. 2. No person, other than the minor's parent or guardian, shall give to any person under the age of sixteen years any cigarette, for such minor's personal use.

SECT. 3. Any person violating any of the foregoing provisions shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars.

Adopted.

WRIGHT of Oxford.

“A.” Amend sections one and two by inserting before the words “under the age of seventeen years” the words ‘known to be.’

Rejected.

LIBBY of Cumberland.

Amendments to Senate Document No. 50.

“A.” Section one amended by striking out in the second line thereof the words “snuff or tobacco in any form.”

Adopted.

“B.” Section two amended by striking out in the third and fourth line, after the word “cigarette,” the words “snuff or tobacco in any form.”

Rejected.

“C.” Strike out all of section four.

Rejected.

WRIGHT of Oxford.

“D.” Amend section 1 by adding thereto the words ‘for such minor's personal use.’

Rejected.
