## STATE OF MAINE.

---

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot  
Tribe of Indians.

---

*Resolved,* That there be paid from the State  
2 treasury to the agent of the Penobscot Indians, to  
3 be appropriated for the benefit of said tribe each  
4 year as follows: forty-four hundred and twenty-  
5 nine dollars and seventy cents, amount of interest  
6 on their trust fund, held by the State for the bene-  
7 fit of said tribe, seventeen hundred dollars for their  
8 annual annuity each year, seven hundred dollars  
9 for agricultural purposes each year, two hundred  
10 dollars for bounty on crops each year, two hundred  
11 dollars for salary of agent each year, one hundred  
12 and fifty dollars to pay a competent person to  
13 instruct and assist said Indians in their agricultural  
14 labors each year, six hundred dollars for schools

15 each year to be used in employing competent  
16 teachers, namely: four hundred dollars for Oldtown  
17 Island, under the supervision of the agent of said  
18 tribe and resident priest, seventy-five dollars for  
19 Olamon Island, under the supervision of the super-  
20 intending school committee of Greenbush, one  
21 hundred and twenty-five dollars on Mattanawcook  
22 Island, under the supervision of the superintending  
23 school committee of Lincoln, and said committee  
24 are required to report as directed in resolve ap-  
25 proved March seventeen, eighteen hundred and  
26 sixty, and it shall be the duty of said agent to see  
27 that the money is fully expended for the education  
28 of the children of the tribe, one hundred dollars  
29 for the salary of said priest each year, provided he  
30 says mass at least twenty-four Sundays during the  
31 year for said tribe of Indians, fifty dollars for the  
32 salary of governor each year, forty dollars for salary  
33 of their lieutenant governor each year; ninety dol-  
34 lars for re-silling and repairs on their church, fifty  
35 dollars for repairing their school-house. All the  
36 foregoing sums to be paid under the direction of the  
36 governor and council.
