STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section eighteen, chapter one hundred forty-two, Revised Statutes, relating to appointment of Council Committee to Reform School and report of same.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section eighteen of chapter one hun-

- 2 dred and forty-two of the Revised Statutes is here-
- 3 by amended by striking out the word "severally"
- 4 in the eighth line of said section, so that said sec-
- 5 tion, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 18. A committee of the council, consisting

- 7 of three, with whom shall be associated one woman,
- 8 shall be appointed by the governor annually, to

9 visit the school from time to time, and examine into 10 the treatment of its inmates, their condition and 11 progress. They shall maintain therein, a letter-12 box, to which the inmates shall at all times have 13 free access, without the knowledge or scrutiny of 14 the officers. They shall hear complaints of ill-15 treatment, and make such suggestions to the super-17 intendent and trustees as they think proper and 18 make a yearly report to the governor and council 18 concerning the condition and wants of the school.
