STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the New England road, so called, in the township of Kingsbury, in the county of Piscataquis.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars
2 be appropriated to be expended on that portion of
3 the New England road, so called, which lies in the
4 township of Kingsbury in the county of Piscataquis,
5 said sum to be expended under the supervision of
6 the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The New England road in said Kingsbury is a United States mail route from Blanchard to Brighton. It is in bad condition, and has been for years. There are a great many bridges which have been injured by freshets. The town of Kingsbury surrendered its charter in 1885, being unable to pay the expenses of paupers and highways, and the whole expense of maintaining said roads has since been paid by the land owners, and the county of Piscataquis. The State made some appropriations years ago, but latterly the road has been neglected, until it is not safe and convenient for public travel.
