STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to authorize the erection of dams and booms in the Androscoggin river, between Topsham and Brunswick.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Nathan L. Marshall and Ansel 2 Dudley their associates, successors and assigns are 3 hereby authorized and empowered to locate, build 4 and maintain in the Androscoggin river, above the 5 railroad bridge and between the towns of Topsham 6 and Brunswick, piers, dams, and side dams, booms 7 and sluices, for the purpose of booming and holding 8 logs, spars, pulpwood and other lumber.

SECT. 2. Said parties shall boom all stray or prize 2 logs and hold them for the space of twenty days,

3 after giving notice to the owners, if known, and if 4 not known by publishing in the Lewiston Journal, 5 three weeks successively, the number and marks of 6 the logs so held, unless claimed by the owners 7 thereof before such notice is given, and shall be 8 entitled to charge fifteen cents for each log so 9 boomed and held by them, and all expenses for said 10 notice; said parties shall hold said logs for such 11 further space not exceeding sixty days, as they 12 may be requested by the owners, if such request is 13 made to them within the twenty days above men-14 tioned and they may charge a reasonable compen-15 sation for such additional space.

All logs not claimed and taken away within the 17 said sixty days shall be forfeited to the owners of 18 the booms, and—said owners shall have a lien on 19 such logs for all the charges above named, which 20 shall continue for ninety days from the date of 21 notice aforesaid and be enforced by attachment,— 22 provided, however, that in case any logs or lumber 23 of an amount exceeding fifty thousand at any one 24 time, shall break away from any boom on the river 25 above the boom hereby authorized or shall escape 26 from the control of the owners thereof, it shall be 27 the duty of the owners of this boom on request of 28 the owners of said logs to boom said logs and raft 29 and hold them for the owner for a period of three 30 months and they shall be entitled to a reasonable 31 compensation therefor. And provided further, if 32 said logs come into said boom on the fall freshets 33 or cannot be secured by reasonable care, the owners 34 of said boom shall not be responsible for the loss 35 thereof. Said owners shall have a lien on all logs 36 boomed and held by them under the above proviso, 37 which shall continue thirty days after the expiration 38 of the three months said logs are to be held, and to 39 be enforced by attachment.

SECT. 3. The parties named in the first section 2 of this act, their associates, successors and assigns 3 may take such lands as may be necessary for the 4 erection and maintenance of said piers, dams and 5 booms, and for connecting the dams with the shores, 6 or any island, and may with their agents and teams, 7 pass and repass over said shores and to and from 8 them, over the lands of other persons, for the 9 purposes aforesaid and for the managing said 10 booms, making compensation therefor as is pro-11 vided in the case of damages for lands taken in 12 laying out highways.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
