IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to repeal sections one and two of chapter one hundred forty-four of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven, relating to lobster fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Sections one and two of chapter one 2 hundred forty-four of the Public Laws of eighteen 3 hundred eighty-seven are hereby repealed.

The Committee on Fisheries and Game to which was referred the petitions of Wilson Thompson and others praying for the repeal of so much of the lobster law as relates to the close time, and for all restrictions to be removed as to fishing, selling, canning, &c., of lobsters from April 1st to July 15th have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report a bill, which is herewith submitted, entitled "An Act to repeal sections one and two of chapter one hundred forty-four of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven."
