STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Martha J. Goss of Portland.

Resolved, That there be paid to Martha J. Goss
2 of Portland a pension of eight dollars per month
3 commencing the first day of February eighteen
4 hundred eighty nine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Eli Goss, the husband of Martha J. Goss, died July 19, 1888. At the time of his decease he was a State pensioner, receiving a pension of twenty (20) dollars a month for injuries received by him in the military service of the State. Mrs. Goss is now sixty years of age, in poor circumstances and ill health. She has no visible means of support, and asks this pension that she may be kept from actual destitution.
