STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to prevent the adulteration of wheat meal.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No manufacturer or other person
2 shall sell, prepare, deliver, put up, expose or offer
3 for sale any article, substance or compound, under
4 or by the name of wheat meal, graham meal or
5 graham flour, made in imitation of pure wheat
6 meal, and not consisting exclusively and wholly
7 of pure wheat meal, unless every box, bucket,
8 barrel or wrapper in or under which such article is
9 sold, delivered or exposed for sale, bears on the top

10 or outer side thereof, in letters not less than one-
11 half inch in length and plainly exposed to view,
12 the words "Compound Wheat Meal."

SECT. 2. Any person who violates any provisions
2 of this act shall forfeit the sum of fifty dollars to
3 the use of any person sueing therefor in an action
4 of debts.
