STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Central Maine Hospital.

Resolved, That the sum of twenty thousand dol-
2 lars be and is hereby appropriated, to be paid out
3 of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appro-
4 priated, in aid of the establishment of a hospital to
5 be located in the city of Lewiston or Auburn,
6 known as, and under the name of, the "Central
7 Maine Hospital"; *provided, however*, that said sum
8 of twenty thousand dollars shall be paid to the
9 treasurer of said Central Maine Hospital, in the fol-
10 lowing manner, namely: When it shall appear to
11 the satisfaction of the Governor that a sum of forty
12 thousand dollars has been raised and paid to the
13 treasurer of said hospital corporation and expended
14 in the purchase of a site and in the erection of suitable
15 hospital buildings, he shall draw his warrant upon

16 the Treasurer of the State for the sum of twenty
17 thousand dollars, payable to the treasurer of said
18 hospital corporation. The above-named sums to
19 be expended in locating, erecting, and maintaining
20 a hospital for the accommodation of the sick and
21 unfortunate.

The Committee on Financial Affairs, to which was referred petition of J. L. H. Cobb and others, asking for an appropriation for Central Maine General Hospital, have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report the accompanying resolve, and that it ought to pass.
