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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-NINE.

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AN ACT to amend chapter seventy-eight, section  
seventeen of the Revised Statutes, relating to powers  
of County Commissioners.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section seventeen of chapter seventy-eight of the  
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking  
3 out in the fourth line of said section the word ‘ten,’  
4 and inserting in place thereof the word “twenty-  
5 five,” so that said section as amended shall read as  
6 follows:

‘SECT. 17. They may obtain loans of money for  
8 the use of their county, and cause notes or  
9 obligations, with coupons for lawful interest, to be

10 issued for payment thereof at such times as they  
11 deem expedient; but such loans shall not exceed  
12 twenty-five thousand dollars, without first obtaining  
13 the consent of the county, substantially as provided  
14 in section fourteen.'

The undersigned are of the opinion that the proposed amendment to chapter seventy-eight of the Revised Statutes is desirable and necessary for the economical management of the business of the county of Cumberland by its commissioners.
