STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to prevent persons from furnishing Intoxicating Liquors to Prisoners.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Whoever gives, sells or delivers to a
2 person confined in any jail, house of correction or
3 other place of confinement, or to a person in
4 custody of any officer, qualified to serve criminal
5 processes, any spirituous or intoxicating liquor, or
6 has in possession, within the precincts of any jail,
7 house of correction or other place of confinement,
8 any such liquor, with intent to convey or deliver
9 the same to any person confined therein, unless
10 under the direction of the physican appointed to

11 attend said prisoner or of the officer in charge of
12 said place of confinement of said prisoner, shall be
13 punished by fine not exceeding twenty dollars, or
14 by imprisonment in the jail or house of correction
15 not exceeding thirty days.

SECT. 2. Municipal and police courts and trial
2 justices shall have jurisdiction of offences under
3 this act.
