STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 61 of chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, relating to record of stallions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 61 of chapter 38 of the Re-2 vised Statutes is hereby amended by adding after 3 the word "bred," in the sixth line, the following: 4 'and it shall be the duty of such register to record 5 such certificate in a book kept for that purpose; 6 copies of such certificate, duly certified by such 7 register, shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts 8 therein contained, in any court in this State. The 9, fee of the register for recording, and for each cer-

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10 tificate, shall be twenty-five cents,' so that said 11 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Sect. 61. The owner or keeper of any stallion 13 for breeding purposes before advertising, by 14 written or printed notices, the service thereof, 15 shall file a certificate with the register of deeds in 16 the county where said stallion is owned, or kept, 17 stating the name, color, age, and size of the same, 18 together with the pedigree of said stallion, as fully 19 as attainable, and the name of the person by whom 20 he was bred. And it shall be the duty of such 21 register to record such certificate in a book kept 22 for that purpose; copies of such certificate, duly 23 certified by such register, shall be prima facie 24 evidence of the facts therein contained, in any 25 court in this State. The fee of the register for re-26 cording, and for each certificate, shall be twenty-27 five cents. Whoever neglects to make and file 28 such certificate shall recover no compensation for 29 said services, and if he knowingly and wilfully 30 makes and files a false certificate of the statements 31 aforesaid, he forfeits one hundred dollars, to be 32 recovered of complaint, indictment or action of 33 debt for the county where the offence is committed.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
