STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to incorporate South Portland Land Im-
provement Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. L renzo D. M. Sweat, Philip Henry
2 Brown, William G. Davis, Horatio N. Jose, Charles
3 W. Goddard and F. H. Harford, their associates
4 and successors are hereby constituted a body cor-
5 porate by the name of South Portland Land Im-
6 provement Company, with power to buy, sell and
7 improve real estate, to construct wharves and ele-
8 vators in Cape Elizabeth, and also with power to
9 construct a bridge for public travel, commencing
10 at some convenient point of land on or near the

11 "Mussey Farm," so-called, in South Portland, and
12 extending therefrom across the tide water of Mill
13 Creek, so-called, to the southerly portion of the
14 land of the "Portland Dry Dock Company," or to
15 land near the southerly end of Portland bridge, as
16 may be deemed best by the stockholders of this
17 company, subject to the approval of the harbor
18 commissioners of the city of Portland.

SECT. 2. Said bridge may be either solid all the
2 way across said creek, or built of piles wholly or in
3 part, and with or without a draw, as may be deter-
4 mined by said harbor commissioners.

SECT. 3. Said bridge, when completed, may be
2 accepted and maintained as a public highway, by
3 the town of Cape Elizabeth or by the county of
4 Cumberland, on such terms and conditions as will
5 be mutually satisfactory to the town, county and
6 stockholders of the company.

SECT. 4. The capital stock of the company shall
2 be a sum not exceeding five hundred thousand dol-
3 lars, to be determined by its stockholders, to be
4 divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
