STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Sandy River Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of *two thousand dollars*
2 be and hereby is appropriated in aid of building a
3 road up the Sandy river valley, from Madrid to
4 Sandy river pond in Franklin county, to be expended
5 under the direction of the county commissioners of
6 Franklin county.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The apparent necessity, as is shown by the increase of business, both of tonnage and passenger travel, over this road, impels us to ask the aid of the State to assist us in building the same. The financial condition of the county is such as to totally prevent its aid or assistance; the township through which the road leads is poor, and worthless for settling or farming, and but little money can be raised on it by taxation. The development of the town of Rangely and its reputation as a summer resort we think fully justifies us in asking this aid and we believe it is for the interest of the people of the State of Maine to grant the same. When this road is open it gives us an *easy* grade and relieves us of the necessity of traveling over one of the worst and steepest three mile hill or roads in the State.
