STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 99 of chapter 11 of the
Revised Statutes, 1883, relating to Schools in
Plantations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section ninety-nine of chapter eleven
2 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out in the fourth line of said section the words
4 "not exceeding one dollar for each inhabitant," so
5 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'SECT. 99. Plantations have the same powers and
7 liabilities as towns, for the formation of districts,
8 electing committees or supervisors, treasurers,

9 collectors and school agents, and for raising,
10 assessing and collecting school money, to be
11 apportioned and expended as in towns; and the
12 districts therein shall elect school district officers,
13 whose powers and duties shall be the same as those
14 of like officers in towns. The assessors of planta-
15 tions may take a census of the inhabitants thereof,
16 at the expense of the plantation, and when so
17 taken, the money raised therein for schools shall be
18 upon the basis of such census and not upon the
19 census of the State.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
