STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE LEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 38 of chapter 91 of the Revised Statutes, relating to liens on lumber.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 38 of chapter 91 of the Re-

- 2 vised Statutes is hereby amended by adding after
- 3 the word "labor," in the second line, the words,
- 4 'or in shoeing horses or oxen, or repairing property
- 5 while thus employed;' and by striking out the
- 6 word "therein" in the third line and inserting
- 7 instead the words, 'on the logs or lumber,' so that
- 8 said section as amended shall read as follows:
- 'Sect. 38. Whoever labors at cutting, hauling, 10 rafting or driving logs or lumber, or at cooking

11 for persons engaged in such labor, or in shoeing 12 horses or oxen or repairing property while thus 13 employed, has a lien on the logs or lumber for the 14 amount due for his personal services and the 15 services performed by his team, which takes pre-16 cedence of all other claims, except liens reserved 17 to the State; continues for sixty days after the 18 logs or lumber arrive at the place of destination for 19 sale or manufacture, and may be enforced by 20 attachment. In such actions the court has the 21 same power to allow and apportion costs as in 22 equity.
