STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to provide a commission to inquire into the system of taxation of other States and this State and report to the Governor and Council.

Resolved, That the governor be and hereby is, by and 2 with the consent of the council authorized and empowered 3 to appoint a commission consisting of three persons whose 4 duty it shall be to inquire into the system adopted by 5 other States to raise revenue for State, county and munici-6 pal expenses, and to provide for a more equal, just and 7 equitable system of taxation, of all kinds of property in 8 this State, for the purposes of said State, county and 9 municipal expenses, that shall be better adapted to the 10 wants of this State and reduce the rate of taxation of the 11 people; and to provide for a better and more effectual 12 system of assessment and collection of taxes in this State; 13 said commissioners to be paid from any money in the 14 State treasury not otherwise appropriated, such a sum for 15 their services as shall be allowed by the governor and 16 council and for necessary clerk hire and incidental ex17 penses and to report to the governor and council on or

18 before the first day of October A. D. 1890; and that the

19 governor shall cause their report to be printed and dis-

20 tributed at the State's expense, three copies of which

21 shall be sent by mail or otherwise to each member of the

22 present legislature to their proper residence; and one

23 thousand copies of said report shall be provided for the

24 use of the next legislature of this State.
