STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the compensation of Sheriffs, and amendatory of chapter 80, Revised Statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. The sheriffs of the several counties of the State shall be allowed an annual compensation to be paid to them from the county treasury, in quarterly payments, on the last days of March, June, September and December, as follows: The sheriffs of the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, Kennebec, Penobscot and York, the sum of six hundred dollars each; Aroostook, Franklin, Hancock, Knox, Lincoln, Oxford, Piscataquis, Sagadahoc, Somerset, Waldo and Washington, the sum of four hundred dollars each.

SECT. 2. Sections twenty, twenty-one, twenty-two, and twenty-three of chapter eighty of the Revised Statutes are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. Paragraph twenty-three of section five of
2 chapter one hundred and sixteen of the Revised Statutes
3 is hereby amended by striking out the word “two,” in the
4 second line, and inserting in place thereof the word ‘three,’
5 so that said paragraph shall read as follows :

‘For each day’s attendance by the sheriff on the
7 supreme judicial, or either of the superior courts, three
8 dollars, to be paid from the county treasury.’
