STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to the repeal of all laws permitting logs cut in Maine to be manufactured in Canada.

Resolved, That our Senators be instructed, and our
2 Representatives in Congress requested, to use all
3 honorable efforts to secure the repeal of all statutes
4 of the United States permitting logs cut in the
5 State of Maine to be manufactured in the Dominion
6 of Canada and imported into the United States
7 free of duty, so that Maine logs may be sawed in
8 Maine mills by Maine laborers, and that our forests
9 may not be stripped to enrich men domiciled in the
10 Dominion and but nominally citizens of the United
11 States, to the end that the frauds now notoriously
12 practiced may be prevented and the discrimination
13 against Maine be abolished.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions, at-
15 tested by the Secretary of State, be forwarded
16 to our Senators and Representatives in Congress,
17 to be by them laid before their respective bodies.
