## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-NINE.

---

AN ACT to amend sections fourteen, sixteen and  
thirty-two of chapter seventy of the Revised Stat-  
utes, in relation to Insolvent Debtors.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Clause III of section sixteen of  
2 chapter seventy of the Revised Statutes is hereby  
3 amended by striking out the word "thirty" in the  
4 fourth line, and inserting instead thereof the word  
5 "fifty," so that said clause as amended shall read  
6 as follows:

'III. That a meeting of the creditors of the  
8 debtor, to prove their debts and choose one or more  
9 assignees of his estate, will be held at a court of

10 insolvency at a time and place designated in the  
11 warrant, not less than ten nor more than fifty days  
12 after the issuing of the same.'

SECT. 2. Section thirty-two of chapter seventy of  
2 the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding  
3 thereto the following: 'The provisions of chapter  
4 seventy-two apply to such bonds, so far as appli-  
5 cable,' so that said section as amended shall read  
6 as follows:

'SECT. 32. The judge shall require the assignee  
8 to give bond for the faithful performance of his  
9 duties, in such sum as he directs, and with such  
10 sureties as he approves. The provisions of chapter  
11 seventy-two apply to such bonds, so far as  
12 applicable.'
