IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to create a lien on Railroad Ties and Ship  
Knees.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Whoever labors in the manufacturing  
2 of railroad ties and ship knees, or is engaged in  
3 cooking for persons engaged in such labor, or  
4 furnishes a team for the hauling of said railroad  
5 ties and ship knees, has a lien on said railroad ties  
6 and ship knees for the amount due him for his per-  
7 sonal labor thereon, or that of his team, which  
8 takes precedence of all other claims, except liens  
9 reserved to the State. Said lien shall continue for  
10 thirty days after said railroad ties are on the line

11 of a railroad, or after said ship knees are delivered  
12 in a ship yard.

SECT. 2. Section 42 of chapter 91 of the Revised  
2 Statutes, is hereby made applicable to suit brought  
3 to enforce the foregoing lien.
