STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Settlers in Madawaska Territory.

Resolved, That in order to carry out substan-2 tially the recommendations of Seth M. Carter, 3 Morrill N. Drew and George H. Smith, commis-4 sioners appointed under resolve approved March 5 10, 1887, and to provide for just and fair treat-6 ment of the settlers whose condition was investi-7 gated by said commissioners, as stated in their re-8 port, the governor and council be directed to 9 appoint a board of three commissioners, who shall 10 have full power to contract for and to purchase, 11 in whole tracts or otherwise, as such commis-12 sioners shall find most advisable upon investiga-13 tion and negotiation with the owners, such lands 14 as may be found necessary or expedient for the

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15 purposes aforesaid in the following named town16 ships or tracts of land in the county of Aroostook,
17 viz.: Township 18 Range 3, 18 Range 4, 18
18 Range 5, 18 Range 6, 18 Range 7, 17 Range 4,
19 17 Range 7, and 17 Range 8, provided that said
20 commissioners shall contract for or purchase no
21 lands at a price exceeding fifty cents per acre.

Said commissioners shall contract for and pur-23 chase any such lands in the name of the State of 24 Maine, and all deeds shall be taken running 25 directly to the State of Maine.

The land agent shall cause all lands so purchased 27 to be surveyed and run off into lots in such manner 28 as said commissioners shall direct, but with a view 29 to correspond as nearly as may be with the actual 30 occupation of such lands, and with a fair and wise 31 provision for the future settlement of any of such 32 lands.

And such commissioners are hereby empowered 34 to direct the land agent to convey to such settlers 35 such parts of said lands as are now in actual occu-36 pation without payment, when justice so demands, 37 and to sell such lands to actual settlers at such 38 price and upon such terms as they may think 39 proper, and either for cash, notes, or labor. The land agent shall keep in his office full records 41 of all tracts for and purchases of said lands, and 42 of all conveyances and sales thereof to the settlers. 43 Should any of said lands remain undisposed of at 44 the conclusion of the labors of said commissioners, 45 they shall be reserved and held for actual settlers 46 thereon, and shall be under the care of the land 47 agent, and may be disposed of by him to actual 48 settlers, as occasion may require, in accordance 49 with the existing provisions of the law relating to 50 the sale of lands for settlement.

There is hereby appropriated, to be used on 52 account of such purchases and surveys and for the 53 reasonable expenses of said commissioners, the 4 sum of thirty thousand dollars, and the governor 55 shall draw his warrant upon the treasury, to be 56 paid out of said sum, to pay for such purchases 57 and surveys and the expenses of said commis-58 sioners.
