## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 73 and 74 of chapter 51 Revised Statutes, relating to disorderly conduct on Railroad Trains.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section seventy-three of chapter
- 2 fifty-one of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended
- 3 by adding after the words "cars" in the second line
- 4 of said section, the words 'or street railroad car,'
- 5 so that said section as amended shall read as
- 6 follows:

'Sect. 73. Whoever behaves in a disorderly or 8 riotous manner while on any train of railroad cars 9 or street railroad car, or uses indecent or profane

- 10 language in such car, is guilty of a breach of the
- 11 peace, and shall be fined not less than five nor more
- 12 than five hundred dollars, or imprisoned in jail not
- 13 less than thirty days nor more than one year, in
- 14 addition to any other penalty provided by law.'
  - Sect. 2. Section seventy-four of chapter fifty-
  - 2 one of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by
  - 3 adding after the word "railroad" in the first line
  - 4 the words 'or street railroad car,' so that said sec-
  - 5 tion as amended shall read as follows:
  - Sect. 74. The conductor of a train of cars on
  - 7 any railroad or street railroad car, may arrest and
  - 8 temporarily hold any person guilty of such breach
  - 9 of the peace, until a warrant can be obtained, or
- 10 he can be placed in custody of the proper officers
- 11 of the law.'
