STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-five of chapter sixty-five of the Revised Statutes, relating to allowances to Widows and Minor Children.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-five of chapter sixty-

- 2 five of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by
- 3 adding thereto the following words, 'and insolvent
- 4 estates, where there is no widow, the judge may,
- 5 at his discretion, make an allowance from the per-
- 6 sonal estate of said deceased, to minor children
- 7 under twelve years of age, when the income from
- 8 their distributive share will be insufficient for their
- 9 support and education,' so that said section as
- 10 amended shall read as follows:

In all insolvent estates, if there is no 'SECT. 25. 12 widow, the judge may make a like allowance from 13 the personal estate to the minor children of the 14 deceased, under fourteen years of age; and to 15 those between fourteen and twenty-one years of 16 age, who from ill health are unable to labor. And 17 if there is a widow and such children by a former 18 wife, the judge may, at his discretion, divide such 19 allowance among the widow and such children of a 20 former wife. And insolvent estates, where there 21 is no widow, the judge may, at his discretion, make 22 an allowance from the personal estate, to minor 23 children under twelve years of age, when the in-24 come from their distributive share will be insuffi-25 cient for their support and education.
