STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven entitled An Act to amend chapter one hundred and forty-four of the Revised Statutes relating to State Pensions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter one hundred 2 and forty-four of the Revised Statutes as amended 3 by chapter one hundred and two of the public laws 4 of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven is hereby 5 further amended by adding after the word “de- 6 pendent” in the fourth line in said section the word 7 ‘child’ so that said section as amended shall read 8 as follows:

‘SECT. 2. The widow during her widowhood,
10 orphan children under twelve years of age, orphan
11 minor children over twelve years of age who are
12 partially or totally disabled by accident or chronic
13 sickness, or the dependent child, parent or sister of
14 any soldier or seaman deceased, are entitled to the
15 same pension as is provided in the preceding sec-
16 tion, and under similar conditions; provided that
17 not more than eight dollars a month shall be paid
18 one family.’

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
